WHAT	The First Annual 1906 Remembrance Exposition Week and Fundraiser — seven days of worship, remembrance, scholarship, exhibition, dialogue, and action marking the 120th year since the 1906 Atlanta Race Massacre. Themed “ Truth, Reconciliation, and Action. ” Built as a permanent annual institution , not a one-time commemoration.

WHY	Over four days in September 1906, a white mob of 5,000 to 10,000 attacked Atlanta’s thriving Black communities, killing at least 25 Black citizens. No one was ever brought to justice. The Exposition Remembers the massacre publicly and annually, in the city where it happened, in order to bring about reconciliation, restoration, and resistance.
